Dress Code

The Dress Code is an addendum to the Behaviour Policy and must be followed by all students at Pearling Season International, up to and including Year 12.

1. Purpose and Aims

The purpose of Pearling Season International School's Dress Code is to:

- Ensure high standards of appearance and consistency across the school
- Encourage a sense of belonging and identity within our school community
- Help prevent fashion and clothing from becoming a distraction to the goals of learning and involvement on the wider school community

2. General Guidance

2.1 Students must be dressed smartly

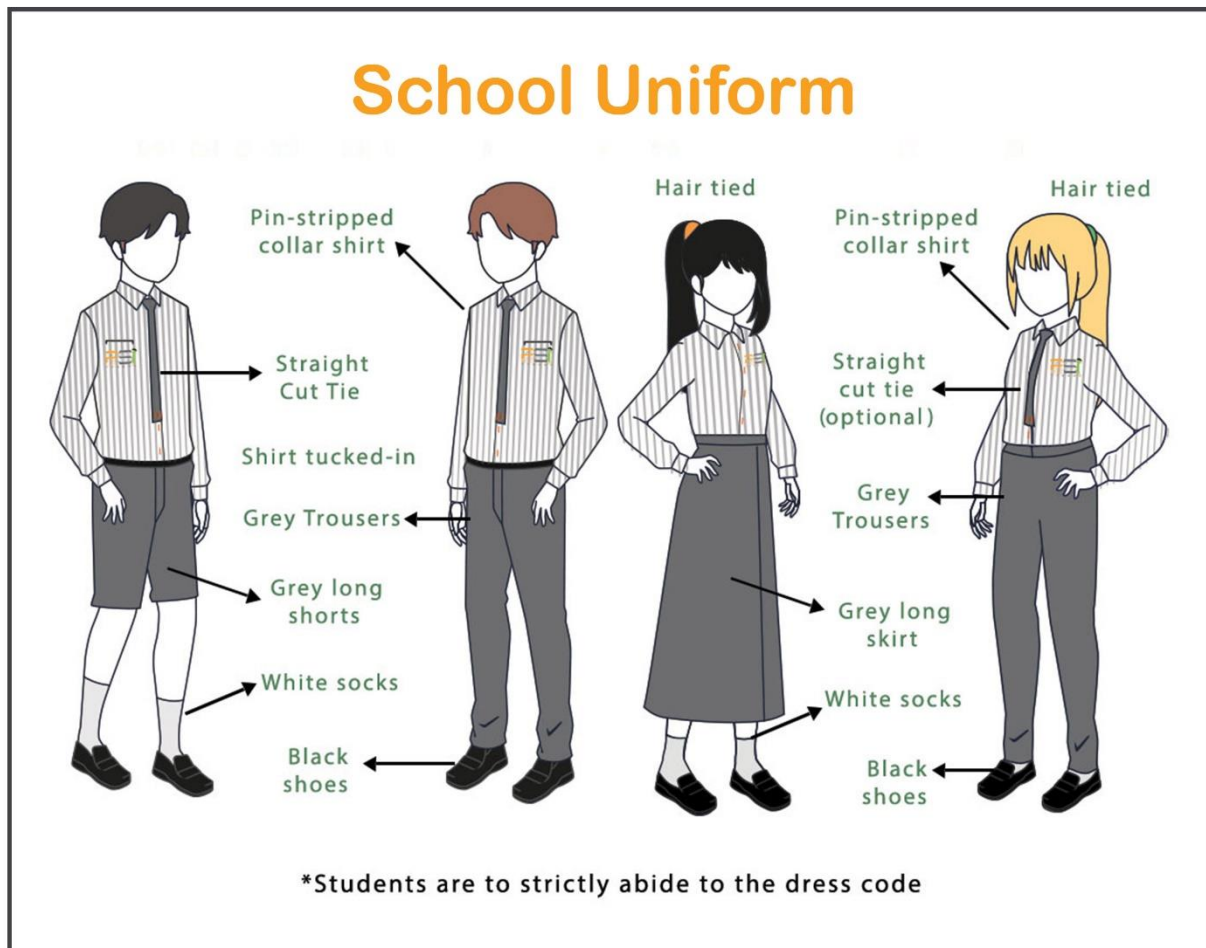
- 2.2 Correct school uniform must be worn every day whilst at school and for online learning
- 2.3 Students are expected to be clean, neat and tidy
- 2.4 Jewellery is not permitted
- 2.5 Trainers/tennis shoes/sneakers are not permitted except when worn for PE
- 2.6 Make-up/cosmetics and nail polish are not permitted
- 2.8 Bright hair colours and extensions are not permitted
- 2.9 Shoes should be polished with no extra features such as colours, stripes, lights
- 2.1 Infringement of the Dress Code will result in sanctions

3. PE Kit – Additional Guidance

- 3.1 Students may attend school in their PE kit on the days that they have PE. They should change back into their normal school uniform after the PE lesson.
- 3.2 Bikinis are not permitted for swimming
- 3.3 Swimming caps are required for all swimming activities
- 3.4 Pool shoes/sandals should be worn around the pool
- 3.5 Swimming kit should be brought to school inside a waterproof bag and must be taken home on the same day after taking part in swimming activities
- 3.6 A towel must be brought for drying when there are swimming activities

4. The Uniform

- 4.1 School uniform is available in the school shop onsite
- 4.2 School shirt must be worn by all and must be tucked in
- 4.3 School tie must be worn by all
- 4.4 Boys have the option of grey school trousers or long grey shorts
- 4.5 Girls have the option of grey school trousers or grey skirt of length below the knee
- 4.6 Grey or white socks should be worn
- 4.7 Formal, closed black shoes must be worn; trainers are not permitted
- 4.8 Dark coloured hair bands or clips may be used to tie back hair



5. PE Kit

- 5.1 School PE kit must be worn for all PE lessons
- 5.2 Trainers must be worn for all PE lessons. These must be sports shoes with proper support and not fashion shoes
- 5.3 Astroturf boots are recommended for those who play football in clubs or at break times
- 5.4 The school PE T-shirt is compulsory for all
- 5.5 Shorts are available for both girls and boys. Girls must wear grey running tights or leggings underneath
- 5.6 A school tracksuit is available for both boys and girls. Other hoodies and jackets may not be worn



6. Additional Winter Options

- 6.1 Winter fleece blazer – available for boys and girls
- 6.2 Grey or white tights for girls
